Mayor's Corner

Everman Residents,

There has been a lot of activity around our fair city.

On June 21, 2017, Chief Randy Sanders retired from the Everman Police Department, after 43 years of service. You will still see Randy around our city. He will remain as the acting Fire Marshall. He will also remain active with the Everman Volunteer Fire Department. He currently has 48 years with the fire department, and is planning to make it to at least 50 years of service.

On July 1, 2017, the Everman Volunteer Fire Department and Police Department hosted the 1st Annual Celebrate America festival. This was a tremendous effort on their part. There was a parade, Car show, bounce houses, laser tag, an incredible DJ and plenty of food and drink. There were also many vendors available to pass out free items along with information about their products and services. This event had a great turn out and will only grow with time. A big thank you goes out to all of the volunteers that made this event possible.

The city of Everman has planting their first milkweed garden, at the corner of Race and Lee. This is in response to the Mayors' Monarch Butterfly Pledge. All of the seed was donated and hopefully will give Monarch Butterflies a spot to feed and lay eggs. In turn, the worms will make cocoons and transform into butterflies. We have been receiving some complaints about our trash and recycling pickups. If you have put out your trash, recycling or a bulk item, (bulk items are to be picked up on Friday) and it was not picked up, please contact city hall at 817-293-0525. We cannot address these issues, if we are not made aware of them.

We have several new Hispanic owned businesses in our city, and some of us may or may not know what kind of services that they offer. The first one is "La Media Naranja". This is a Mexican restaurant that offers some traditional Mexican food and tortas (sandwiches). They also offer a Breakfast Buffet on Sundays. They are located at 1809 Everman Parkway (Everman Shopping Center).

Next is "Blessa's Beauty Salon". This is a traditional Beauty Salon that also offers men's haircuts and has a nail salon. They are located at 1813 Everman Parkway (Everman Shopping Center).

"EI Chamoy Restaurant" located at the corner of Wichita and Trammell. This location offers quick food items along with fresh fruits, yogurts, shaved ice and fruit drinks.

The next business is not currently open for business but will be opened soon. It is called "Expendio De Pan Anakaren". This is a Mexican Bakery and will offer a plethora of baked goods. I'm being told that their items are incredible. They will be located in the Everman Shopping Center as well.

Then finally, we have the "Taco Oasis", located at 623 East Enon. Yes, this is a Mexican restaurant. I have not eaten there yet, but have been told that the food items are incredible.

Everman is still experiencing in our business community. We have a new restaurant named "All J's Family Restaurant" located at 600 West Enon. They offer home cooking and BBQ items on their menu. All NSF checks will be charged a service charge, the price to be adjusted periodically to reflect banks charge. All NSF checks are to be paid for with cash or money order, no checks will be accepted for a payment of an NSF. Once the City gets the NSF check back, it will not be re-sent to the bank. The bank presents the check two (2) times before returning it to the City. If a customer gives the City an NSF check two (2) times in a one (1) year period, then that customer forfeits the right to write checks for a one (1) year period, ending a year after the date of the second NSF check given. Customers that have given an NSF check will be notified of such and given three (3) working days to pay for the NSF check and the service charge. If on the Fourth (4th) working day, the NSF check has not been paid for, the water will be cut off and an additional service charge will be added to the account.

We have some street work going on around town. By this posting Fort Worth should be finished with their section of Enon. The County plans on starting back in our area on August 2nd. They will start with the overlay of Enon from Thompson to just past Forest Hill Drive. They chose this street first while we wait on ATMOS to lower the gas lines on our other projects for this go around which are; Chambers Creek, Smith, Langley and the east sections of Russell and Marlene.

I need your help; we have been receiving a lot of trash in our parks and along our roadways. Our Park Crew spends several hours each workday just picking up from the night before from park visitors. Some folks feel that it's alright to empty the trash from their cars onto the parking lot. What makes this sad is there are trashcans and dumpsters nearby. Then on to roadways, a lot of what we are getting is fence panels and tires and just trash thrown from a moving vehicle. All these actions are illegal dumping.

Now for your help. Please report anyone that you see trashing our parks or streets to the police. A vehicle ID and tag number will help. Those that they catch and ticket will go before our Judge and he does not take kindly to these infractions. Lastly, we are planning an electronics recycle day on September 23, 2017 from 9am until noon. This will be of no charge to you the State and County is picking up our bill, you will need to show your current water bill for them to take your electronics and such. The location for the pickup will be at the Joe C. Bean High School, 1000 S. Race at the South Race Street Parking lot. To get a list of what items they will take. Just pick up a flyer at City Hall or the Library. Sorry but No Tires, Paint, Light bulbs, Batteries, Gasoline, Oils, Freon Items or Normal Household Trash.

CODE COMPLIANCE

<u>425 Trash Time/Placement</u> – Trash allowed at curb on Tuesdays and Fridays only, no earlier than 6pm the day prior, only if prepared/contained properly

<u>679 Zoning Ordinance</u> - Parking permitted on wholly paved surface comprised of asphalt or concrete only, in natural driveway.

554 Nuisance - Accumulation of refuse, limbs (10.4), trash, garbage, rubbish, and/or items stored on private property, in public view, is not permitted. Be sure to prepare discarded items properly in order to be removed by City contracted waste removal company otherwise remove on your own. Water account holder, with picture I. D., may take certain items to C & D Landfill at 4144 Dick Price Rd. In Kennedale, TX, 4 times a year. Be sure to call (817-561-7777) to confirm what items they will take.

554 Nuisance 10.6 - Grass, plants, weeds, otherwise not cultivated, in excess of 10 inches in height are not permitted including but not limited to curb and fence lines. A violation of this ordinance may also be in violation of section 10.5 (see below) as well as a fire hazard and creating an environment for the infestation of rodents

<u>554 Nuisance</u> <u>10.5</u>- Standing water is prohibited as it creates a breeding ground for mosquitoes.

With the retirement of Chief Sanders, I have been asked to serve as the Director of Emergency Services. This month, I want to share with you a little bit about myself and the vision I have for our Police, Fire and Emergency Medical Services Departments. NOTES FROM PUBLIC WORKS

Mosquitoes are a nuisance and of course no one likes the itch they leave behind. But, mosquitoes are more than just a nuisance. They can be deadly. They can infect humans with diseases than have been known to kill. This is why, it is so important for people to educate themselves on controlling the environment in which the mosquitoes thrive. Everyone should know not to allow containers to hold stagnant water. This is the number one breeding ground for mosquitoes. The mosquito larvae can survive in less than an inch of water. Always make sure flowerpots are free of standing water, dispose of old tires, coffee cans, and other items that hold water. Also get rid of the mosquito's favorite hiding places by removing trash, debris, refuse, stacked wood, and brush. Keep trees and bushes trimmed. Keep lawns mowed. Keep swimming pools, no matter the size, free of stagnant water. Make sure the water is well chlorinated and clear. Mosquitoes do not like chlorinated water. Change the water in kiddy pools often and do not leave water in the kiddy pools when not in use. Report to the city any stagnant water, unclean premises, and illegal dumping. By controlling these environmental issues we will all have

Greetings all,

We are excited to have the new water meter project near completion. The new system allows the remote reading of the meters therefore human error will no longer be an issue. We are still having a problem with citizens tampering with the utilities (turning the water on after it has been turned off for one reason or another). Water Supply Tampering - Code of Ordinances - Section 20-199 (#10), It is unlawful to remove, change, interfere with or tamper with any water meter and (#11) to turn on the water supply to any building where the supply has been turned off for non-payment. The resident will be issued citations for the theft/tampering.

Should you need your water turned off for repairs please call 817-293-0525 during regular business hours or 817-293-2923 after hours for emergency repairs only. Should the repair be of a non emergency nature a fee will be charged for after hour turn offs.

The City of Everman would like your assistance in identifying leaks. If you notice water around your meter box or running down the road, please call 817-293-0525 to report the leak, we will send a utility worker to investigate the cause and correct it if the leak is the responsibility of the City.
